Protect and Restore the Shoreline

#### **PLAN RECOMMENDATIONS** Work with the Maryland Port Administration to utilize tested, underwater material dredged from the Port's shipping channel to create living shorelines through "beneficial use and 1.1 innovative reuse of dredged material." Phase placement of dredge material, planned in coordination with the overall project timeline and availability of material from the Port. Utilize a range of strategies to create living shoreline zones that respond to site conditions 1.3 and uses, such as marsh, sandy beach, and rocky edges. Implement water quality testing and improvements in concert with the living shoreline, including green infrastructure for stormwater management facilities, trash collectors, and upland forest buffers. Expand upland habitat areas around the Middle Branch by converting spaces within parks from large expanses of turf grass to a mix of forest and meadow plantings that frame lawns for views and gatherings. Develop multiple messaging platforms that share information about Middle Branch's water quality and can reach diverse audiences, public awareness and inspire community engagement and stewardship. Encourage the regional scientific community to use Middle Branch as a case study for education and research. Early restoration sites present opportunities to conduct long-term evaluations and develop best practices.


















#### PLAN RECOMMENDATIONS

- Create a 3-mile "Loop Trail" as a separated-use facility with generous lanes for both bikes and pedestrians, which encircles the Middle Branch and creates high-quality connectivity and recreation opportunities.
- Construct a new East-West Pedestrian Bridge south of I-95 that closes the "Loop" and connects Westport with Port Covington.
- Create a continuous Shoreline Trail for public access along 11 miles of shoreline from Port

  Covington and Locust Point to Brooklyn and Masonville Cove, connecting to multi-use

  Neighborhood Connectors that extend from the central Middle Branch Loop Trail to
  neighborhoods and regional trails.
- 2.4 Create Neighborhood Connector trails linking the Middle Branch Loop Trail and Shoreline Trail to neighborhood parks and regional trails.
- 2.5 Prioritize Complete Streets improvements to increase connectivity in neighborhoods and between neighborhoods and the waterfront.
- Undertake multi-model improvements on Vietnam Veterans Memorial Bridge by reducing vehicle traffic to 4 lanes and grouping 2-way bicycle and pedestrian lanes in a protected zone on western edge of the bridge.
  - Conduct a thorough engineering study to evaluate options for redesigning Hanover-Potee
- 2.7 Street corridor, including the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Bridge, with the goal of rationalizing through-traffic and improving safety and access for pedestrians and local traffic.
- 2.8 Implement "quick-build" projects to establish an Interim Loop Trail around the Middle Branch while planning for longer-term changes.
  - Enhance truck freight access between port areas and regional highways by enabling
- 2.9 southbound turn from Frankfurst Avenue onto Potee Street (Rt. 2), to reach I-95 via Patapsco Avenue and South Caton Avenue.

# Activated and Inclusive Parks

PLAN RECOMMENDATIONS
Coordinate planning and implementation of capital projects and programming across the park-shed.
Connect existing waterfront parks with proposed new parks, new developments, and natural areas, and unifying these parks and open spaces into an accessible and active waterfront for all.
Create new waterfront anchors, which provide major amenities and create destinations in waterfront parks.
Reshape and reorient the Middle Branch Park lawn with views across the water and sightlines to downtown and the addition of a performance stage for hosting festivals and other events.
Create a covered, open-air event pavilion be situated near the event lawn in Middle Branch Park.
Building a new, expanded boathouse that accommodates future growth in BCRP's boating programs and Baltimore Community Rowing.
Transform the existing boathouse into a concession and event space.
Improve existing piers, add new piers, and diversify ways to access the water with new beaches and boat launches, all in support of increased access to water-based recreation and educational programming.
Curate and produce a steady and reliable series of culturally relevant programming opportunities in different seasons of the year.
Develop Splash!, a waterfront event produced for engagement during the planning process, from a one-time event into an annually recurring program.
Establish a new waterfront park along the Westport waterfront, along with a memorial for the Baltimore Black Sox and other South Baltimore sports legends.





4.1	Continue funding of established equity initiatives including YouthWorks grants, the South Baltimore Employment Connection Center, Commercial Corridor Funding, and the SBGP Community Development Fund.
4.2	Expand two educational pilot programs, the Morgan State University Fellowship and the Community Design Lab, into sustained annual initiatives.
4.3	Support disadvantaged businesses around the Middle Branch, helping them to become M/W/DBE certified and connecting them with funding opportunities.
4.4	Utilize the SBGP Community Development Fund, a new funding mechanism tailored to support equitable investment in South Baltimore communities.
4.5	Honor and celebrate African American culture through the creation of a heritage district.
4.6	Support and catalyze site-specific development projects by fostering collaborations among communities, property owners, financing entities, local government, potential anchor tenants or user groups
4.7	Plan anchor projects in or adjacent to parks to draw visitors and activity to the waterfront, support O&M costs, and create employment, education and business opportunities for residents
4.8	Support environmental education and aquaculture programs of local non-profits Environmental Justice Journalism Initiative (EJJI) and Minorities in Aquaculture (MIA) currently operating at the Middle Branch Marina.
4.9	Establish a native plant nursery, managed and staffed by South Baltimore residents, to supply park improvement projects and Middle Branch communities with locally grown plants and locally made building materials.
4.10	Start a seasonal food truck program in Middle Branch Park, supporting local businesses development and laying groundwork for a year-round Waterfront Marketplace selling culturally authentic products, food and art.
4.11	Add additional multi-purpose fields to Reedbird Park to enable hosting regional athletic events and tournaments.



	PLAN RECOMMENDATIONS
1.1	SBGP, SB7, and the City strategize and align funding priorities for RMB projects and programs, ongoing operations, and equity initiatives.
1.2	City and SBGP set annual allocations of casino LIG funds towards RMB initiatives with targets for capital, O&M, programs, and equity investments.
1.3	SBGP, SB7, and community organizations in Brooklyn, Curtis Bay & Locust Point create an agreement to include neighborhoods in implementation plans; include an allocation of SB7 funding for RMB initiatives.
1.4	Consider hiring full-time, dedicated funding development staff to monitor grant opportunities, build relationships with elected officials and funders, and oversee proposal development.
1.5	Develop an inclusive programming strategy for break-even, nominal, or free access for community residents; identify operators and content providers, expense and revenue projections, staffing, equipment, and facility needs.
1.6	Consider models to weigh the financial benefits and risks of serving as a programming operator versus contracting with third-party providers.
1.7	Analyze revenue-generating opportunities (such as facility rentals, concessions, permitting fees), so that the City, the RMB management entity, and other partners share benefits of user fees and program revenue.
1.8	Assess opportunities to enter into ground leases or strategically purchase properties that will reduce costs or generate revenue for RMB operations and equity initiatives over the long term.
1.9	Conduct market/feasibility studies for sites under consideration, including restrictions, expenses, and potential revenue.
1.10	Determine the appetite of stakeholders for upgrading and monetizing existing parking lots.



#### PLAN RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 Phase 1: Deliver on the large pipeline of projects that are already funded and underway, in order to maintain momentum and build public trust.
- 2.2 Phase 2: Build out the core network of connectivity, establish major equity initiatives, and undertake "quick-build" enhancements.
- 2.3 Phase 3: Harness the success from the previous phases to build coalitions and attract funding for a multiple large capital projects.
- Phase 4: Maintain steady, ongoing progress that builds on the success established in the first decade, continuing to add to an already robust network of parks, trails, economic development, and equity projects around the Middle Branch.


